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Department 13 Rules

1. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to show visual proof of the variety prior to judging.
2. Vegetables should be true to type, uniform in size and shape, free from disease or injury, clean and with 2" of tops on carrots, beets or similar varieties.
3. The outer leaves on cabbage, onions or similar vegetables should be left on the exhibit.
4. Entries are limited to one per class per exhibitor.
5. Exhibit removal time starts at 8:00pm on the last day of the fair.
6. Index size informational cards describing exhibit (variety, uses, seed company, etc.) are encouraged.

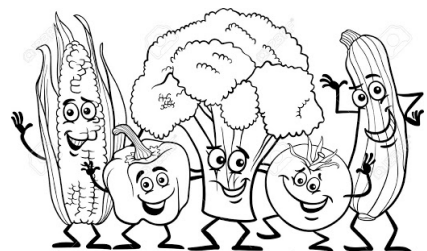
